Subject: Allocation of MBBS/BDS Seats from Central Pool for spouse and children of terrorist victims for the academic year 2023-24.

Respected Sir / Madam,

I am directed to forward herewith a copy of Guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare for selection and nomination of eligible candidates against central pool MBBS/BDS seats under the Civilian Terrorist Victims Category mentioned at para 3 (3) for the academic year 2023-24. Eligibility criteria for selection of the candidates is mentioned against this category in the guidelines.

- 2. Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has also allotted 04 (four) MBBS seats from the Central Pool for nomination of candidates under the category of Civilian Terrorist Victims for the academic year i.e. 2023-24. These four MBBS seats will be allotted amongst the following colleges/Institutions:-
 - (i) A.N. Magadh Medical College, Gaya, Bihar : 1 (one)
 - (ii) Grant Medical College, Mumbai, Maharashtra: 1 (one)
 - (iii) Pt. JNM Medical College, Raipur, Chhattisgarh: 2 (two)
- 3. The order of priority prescribed by MHA for allocation of MBBS seats to the wards of civilian victims of terrorism is given below:
 - (a) Priority-I: Children whose both parents have been killed by terrorists.
 - (b) Priority-II: Children of families whose sole bread earners has been killed by terrorists.
 - (c) Priority-III: Wards of victims with permanent disability and serious injury caused by terrorist operations.
- 4. It is intimated that <u>this Ministry is not conducting any examination in this regard.</u> The selection of eligible candidates will be made as per guidelines issued by Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.
- 5. State Government (s) / Union Territory Administration (s) may kindly give wide publicity while inviting application (s) from eligible candidates as indicated above for the academic year 2023-24 for allocation of MBBS/BDS seats from Central Pool for spouse and children of civilian terrorist victims.

2. Selection of candidates by UTs of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh:

2.1 Eligibility conditions:

Central Pool MBBS seats are being allocated to the UTs of Jammu & Kashmir & Ladakh for selection and nominations of the candidates from the UTs of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh belong to either of the following three categories:-

- 1. Children of families where a parent or a direct member of the family has been killed in acts of terrorism or has been an innocent victim in cross-firing or in firing by armed forces in combating terrorism;
- 2. Children of such persons who are exposed to substantive risk due to their assignment mainly relating to combating acts of terrorism; added weightage is to be given to persons who have come in the 'hit list' of terrorist organizations; and
- 3. Children of such families who have migrated from Kashmir due to the current situation and have lost their means of livelihood including their business or use of their property.

The UT Governments of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh have to ensure that the candidates selected should fall within one of the above three categories. The children of All India Service Officers posted in the State would also be eligible to participate in the said merit system. Selection of candidates in Category (iii) above should be entirely on merit among the eligible candidates in this category.

2.2 Education Qualification:

As per Graduate Medical Education Regulation of National Medical Commission, the candidate must have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually and must have obtained a minimum of 50% marks (40% for SC/ST/OBC and 45% for PWD category candidates) taken together in Physics, Chemistry, Biology/Bio-Technology at the qualifying examination.

2.3 Selection of Candidates:

The selection of candidates will be made on the basis of rank obtained in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET)-2023 being conducted by National Testing Agency. As per Graduate Medical Education Regulationsof National Medical Commission, it shall be necessary for the candidates to obtain minimum marks at 50th percentile at NEET 2023. However, in respect of candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes the minimum marks shall be at 40th percentile. In respect of candidates with specified disability, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile. The percentile shall be determined on the basis of highest marks secured in the All India Common merit list in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test for admission to MBBS/BDS courses.

2.4 Reservation:

The reservation policy being followed by the UTs of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh will apply on Central Pool MBBS/BDS seats.

4.2 Selection of Candidates:

The selection of candidates will be made on the basis of rank obtained in the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET)-2023 being conducted by National Testing Agency. As per Graduate Medical Education Regulations of National Medical Commission, it shall be necessary for the candidates to obtain minimum marks at 50th percentile at NEET, 2023. In respect of candidates with locomotory disability of lower limbs, the minimum marks shall be at 45th percentile. The percentile shall be determined on the basis of highest marks secured in the All India common merit list in National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test for admission to MBBS/BDS courses.
